General objective

Specific objectives

To reduce sexual behavior at risk of acquiring/transmitting HIV and other STI in women living in the rural area surrounding the clinical center by implementing a composite prevention model based on primary prevention strategies and strategies of education, active involvement and empowerment of the female community.

- 1. Promoting the active involvement ("empowerment") of women in the management of their sexual and reproductive health.
- 2. Reduce the risk acquisition behaviour of HIV and other STI in the female population.
- 3. Reduce the number of new cases of HIV and other ITS infection in the rural reference area.
- Identification of specific critical areas in women in terms of barriers to prevention of HIV transmission/acquisition and other ITS prior to intervention.
- **Expected outcomes**
- 2. Increased testing offer among women living in the intervention area during the project development period
- 3. Reduction of HIV acquisition/transmission risk behaviours and of other TSIs

- 4. Increased awareness among women of responsible sexuality
- 5. Reduction in the number of incident cases of HIV and other ITS per period of observation compared to what was reported before the intervention.
